Let me begin by offering my sincere thanks and appreciation to my predecessor, Jeff Corker, and his very able wife (and reunion planning assistant) Christina. The Association is blessed to have members like Jeff and Christina. Their energy and commitment set a high bar for all of us. Richel and I realize that we have some big shoes to fill as we assume this responsibility and will strive to live up to the example they have set.

**Reunion 2013:** I'm especially happy to announce that planning for the 2013 cruise reunion is ahead of schedule. As of this date (29 Nov) we have already booked a total of 13 cabins. Indications are that we're going to have a great turn out. Here's a quick summary of the cruise details:

# Stateroom Costs will be slightly less than estimated due to the group booking discount:

**NOTE:** These rates are guaranteed through 30 December. I am working with Celebrity to get this date extended but recommend you reserve a cabin soon as possible to avoid a possible increase.

## **Other Costs:**

Gratuities: from \$57.50/person
(\$11/day/person)
Taxes and fees: \$105.89 per person

**CABIN CREDITS:** Each cabin will receive a \$50 credit. This can be used as you see fit: to pay gratuities, offset on-board expenses, etc. Because we have booked at least 8 cabins the group will also receive an additional rebate equal to one passenger fare divided by the number of cabins. This, too, will be credited to your cabin account. If we book 16 cabins, we will receive a second "passenger fare" credited back to the group.

**RESERVATIONS:** Call Erika Trivett at Celebrity Cruise lines (1-888-727-4907 x13337) to reserve your cabin. If she is not available any other agent at that number will be able to help you. Be sure to ask for the "11th Engineer Battalion Association" reunion, using cruise Group Number 2059484.

**DEPOSIT:** When you make your reservation a credit card deposit will be required. If you want to select your cabin (recommended) the deposit is \$100 per person. You can also reserve a cabin but let the cruise line assign you one later for a deposit of only \$25 per person.

FINAL PAYMENT: Due NLT 25 Sept 2013.

IMPORTANT: The stop in Mexico means this is classified as an *international* cruise....ALL personnel (except children under the age of 16) must have a current US Passport.

**Excursions:** I am looking into excursions for our stops in Cozumel and Key West and will provide more details in the next Panther Press. If you have any special requests or recommendations please contact me as soon as possible.

## From the Treasurer:

At the reunion annual meeting it was agreed that we should seek to have the 11<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion Association recognized as a 503(c)(19) Veterans Organization.

I contacted the IRS and established the Association as a 503(c)(19) Veterans Organization. If the association wanted to file a form 1023 and pay \$400 we would be issued a Determination Letter. The IRS explained that we did not need the Determination Letter to be a 503(c)(19) Veterans Organization as long as the association annually filed a Form 990-N (e.Postcard). I will file the 990-N for 2012 in January.

I want to thank everyone that has sent in their 2012 dues. We have 136 names in our member database. To date I have received 2012 dues payments from 90 members (65%). For 2013, 45 members (33%) have already sent in their 2013 dues. We also want to thank those members that included a donation to the General Fund. The dues payments support:

- communications with our members • without email addresses to include the Newsletter distribution,
- awards for the 11<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion of • Soldier, NCO, and Officer of the Year,

- reunion planning and preparation costs, • and
- the development and maintenance of our • new website.

Ron Smoker and I communicate almost daily, and he has been very good in sending out membership cards to those that have paid, so if you do not have a current membership card you are most likely delinguent.

As of this writing at the end of December we have over \$10k in our checking account. We have about \$3.5k in outstanding liabilities which we will pay when we receive the bills, so we expect the balance to go down after these bills are paid. #### And a few notes from your Editor:

Mike Ellegood has led our effort to support an engineer unit overseas. A recap of what our association has accomplished in this effort follows:

"Support of the 63<sup>rd</sup> Engineer Company (CSE)" By now, most of our members are aware of our Association's support of the 63<sup>rd</sup> Engineer Company, Combat Support Equipment's deployment to Afghanistan. The plan, as it was initially conceived, was to ship "Care" packages to the unit via USPS and through the Unit Commander, CPT Robert Etheridge. Since there were a number of volunteers and since the deployment was anticipated to last nine months. it was felt that we needed to add some structure to the effort. Without structure, it was probable that the unit would receive many packages in one or two months and then none for the remainder of the tour. One of our members, LTC (ret) Michael S. Ellegood, PE, volunteered to organize the effort. Mike developed a "duty roster" assigning a volunteer to one of the deployment months.

There were more volunteers than months so the holiday months had more than one volunteer.

In an E-mail, CPT Etheridge expressed that the unit wanted coffee, specifically Keurig type coffee pods. Mike and Julie Ellegood have a family friend who is a Starbucks District Manager in Phoenix, Arizona. After hearing of the 63<sup>rd</sup>'s want, he volunteered to solicit the support of his Starbuck's District. His store managers responded with great enthusiasm! Not only did the unit receive some surplus coffee but also many of the stores had donation boxes and the customers responded with even more enthusiasm. Over a one-month period over 50 pounds of coffee were collected and delivered to Mike and Julie. These were put into USPS large priority flat rate boxes for shipment. Over a four month period these "Care" packages were shipped to CPT Etheridge.

The unit has received them and responded with thank you notes expressing their profound appreciation for the Association's support! See the photo/thank you message from the 63<sup>rd</sup> and note to Dominique and Sean at Starbucks below.

The 63<sup>rd</sup> is expected to DEROS (come back stateside) in March of 2013 and it takes about six weeks for mail to reach the Unit. So the last packages should be shipped in mid-January, 2013.

As a side note, based on the identification of the 63<sup>rd</sup> Engineer Company by our association, the Huntsville SAME Post sent 2 shipments to the 63<sup>rd</sup> of a total of 25 boxes weighing more than 260 lbs.
