From the President:

This year the 11th Engineer Battalion Association will share the annual Reunion with the 547th Engineer Battalion Association. Both Associations scheduled their 2014 Reunion in Charleston, SC in September, therefore agreed to share the Hotel/events for negotiating the best prices for a higher volume of participation.

My first assignment was to Uijongbu, Korea to the 11th Engineer Battalion (Combat) from January 1967 through March 1968. My PCS assignment was to Darmstadt, Germany to the 547th Engineer Battalion (Combat) from April 1968 to July 1969. Significant events for me were the bridging of the Han River in Korea, and twice bridging the Rhine River, in Germany.

From the 1st Vice President:

Your "reunion committee" has been busy this winter putting the final touches on our 2014 reunion in Charleston and initiating the planning process for our 2015 excursion to Arizona.

- 1. **CHARLESTON, SC:** The 2014 reunion will be unique in that we have capitalized on an opportunity to link up with the 547th Engineer Battalion Association whose members will be joining us in Charleston. By taking advantage of our combined numbers we were able to secure a very favorable hotel rate and improve our negotiating position for everything from transportation to local area discounts.
 - a. **THE VENUE:** Charleston is world-class venue that has been named the **#1 United States City** by the Condé Nast Readers' Choice Awards for an unprecedented *third* consecutive year.

 It's a beautiful coastal destination with easy access by air or interstate. Charleston is deeply immersed in southern hospitality and exudes a warm, inviting charm. It offers much in the way of American history, culture, architecture, fine or casual cuisine, exciting and varied night life and yes...shopping. If you have not yet visited this jewel of a southern city now is your chance. If you have already been there then you know what I mean...it's time to do it again!
 - b. THE AGENDA: Please refer to the attached paper (Subject: 2014 Reunion Agenda) for the day to day details of our planned Charleston activities. This year's reunion (from Thursday, 18 Sept through Sunday, 21 Sept departing on Monday, 22 Sept) includes a visit to The Citadel to tour the facilities and see their famed Cadet Parade, a visit to Patriots Point and a wreath-laying ceremony at the Congressional Medal of Honor Museum. There is also ample time for you to explore on your own....not to mention the renewing of old friendships and making new ones in the Hospitality Suite. NOTE: If you desire to come early or stay late the Charleston Plaza Hotel (formerly the InnPlace Hotel) has agreed to extend the very favorable room rates (see below) for up to 3 days on either side of the reunion. Two Info Papers are attached with the details of our visit to The Citadel and Patriots Point.
 - c. **THE HOTEL:** This year's reunion will be held at the Charleston Plaza Hotel. Info Paper #3, Subj: Hotel Info & Registration Procedures (attached) provides all the details. The Charleston Plaza Hotel is a full service establishment in North Charleston that has offered us a group rate of \$99/night (+ tax = ~\$113). This rate includes: breakfast for two, free shuttle service to/from the airport and local shopping/restaurants, a dedicated Hospitality Suite and free on-site parking. The Charleston Plaza Hotel also offers a full-service restaurant, banquet facilities, a modern exercise facility with both indoor and outdoor pools, and a complete business center with several PCs and printers. NOTE: The InnPlace Hotel was recently been purchased by Marriott and renamed the Charleston Plaza Hotel. This is a net positive given the world-wide reputation of the Marriott brand. I do not know the transition schedule for the re-branding process but it should be invisible to us and will have no impact on the rates and amenities that we have already contracted for.

d. REGISTRATION:

- I. Please refer to Info Paper #3 (Hotel Info & Registration Procedures) and complete and submit the Reunion Registration Form (attached) as soon as possible.
- II. Please call the Charleston Plaza Hotel (see Info Paper #3) and make your room reservation. I urge that you do this now to avoid any last minute difficulties and help us manage the block of rooms we have reserved.
- III. If you have any questions do not hesitate to call or email me.
- 2. Reunion 2015: Prescott, AZ. Mike & Julie Ellegood volunteered to take this on and have been active scoping out possibilities for our 2015 trip to Arizona. They have received a good offer from a Prescott hotel and are busy working the details. They've also done a lot of legwork on potential agenda items including: a trip to the Grand Canyon; possible trips to Sedona and Oak Creek Canyon; guided walking tours of Prescott; and for the adventurous day hiking in Prescott National Forest. Golf, a Prescott antique prowl, Flagstaff and a visit to Lowell Observatory are also possibilities. More details on this when we convene in Charleston. Thanks Mike and Julie for all you've done!!

Below is an info paper #4, Subject: 11th Brigade Engineer Battalion (BEB), on the future of the 11th Engineer Battalion. There are ongoing big changes for engineer units.

Planning for the 2015 11th Engineer Combat Battalion Reunion:

Although there is almost a year and a half before the 2015 Reunion, your committee has been hard at work. The reunion will be held in Prescott, Arizona, home of the first territorial capital of Arizona. It is a beautiful mountain community of 40,000 nestled in the Bradshaw Mountains of Arizona. At a 5600-foot elevation, Prescott offers four distinct seasons, all of them mild.

The reunion hotel is expected to be the Hassayampa, a historic hotel constructed in 1929 offering a combination of southwestern and art deco architecture. Located just off of the town square, it is within convenient walking distance to many local attractions including the Sharlot Hall Museum that depicts life as it was in the old west.

The major outing will be a day trip to the Grand Canyon. This is about a two-hour coach ride each way. This plus several hours at the Grand Canyon will make for a full day.

In addition to our meetings, auction, banquet, memorial service and general camaraderie there are a number of other activities in Prescott including the Phippen Museum of Western Art, numerous hiking trails, pub crawling along Whiskey Row, antique shopping, the restored Elks Theater (don't know yet about shows scheduled) and side trips to Sedona, Jerome and Flagstaff.

Prescott is about 100mile northwest of Phoenix. There is a convenient and inexpensive shuttle service from Phoenix Sky Harbor Airport that offers military discounts for groups like ours.

More later as plans develop further.

INFORMATION PAPER #4

SUBJECT: 11TH Brigade Engineer Battalion (BEB)

- 1. With the cessation of hostilities in Iraq and pending withdrawal from Afghanistan the Army has begun the process of "downsizing". The conversion from wartime to a peacetime force will result in an approximate 14% reduction in active duty end-strength or a draw-down of ~80,000 soldiers from 570,000 to 490,000.
- 2. As part of the downsizing the number of Brigade Combat Teams (BCTs) will be reduced from 45 to 32 and reorganized to reflect the new BCT 2020 design. This new structure reorganizes the Army's infantry and armor brigades by adding a third maneuver battalion and additional engineer and artillery capabilities. Stryker brigades, which currently have three maneuver battalions, but no brigade special troops battalion, will now get a Brigade Engineer Battalion (BEB).
- 3. Operations in Iraq and Afghanistan revealed significant gaps in the Engineer capabilities in the modular BCTs. The most significant gap was in the area of mission command. Senior Army leaders also recognized that the modular BCT lacked the required horizontal, gap crossing, breaching and route clearance capabilities. Responding to these concerns, the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence (CoE), in collaboration with Maneuver CoE, designed a BCT Engineer Battalion (BEB) concept to replace the current brigade special troops battalion within the Armored and Infantry BCTs. It also formed an Engineer battalion in the Stryker BCTs.
- 4. The re-organized BEB provides BCTs with critically needed Engineer, Military Intelligence, Signal and CBRN capabilities enabling it to conduct decisive action with their organic assets. The BEB will consist of two engineer companies to address mission command, bridging, breaching, route clearance and horizontal capability gaps. The BEB will also provide administrative and sustainment support for the following units:
 - A Military Intelligence company
 - A Signal company and
 - A Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) platoon.
- 5. While the BEB does provide some growth to the Engineer Regiment and an increase in command opportunities, this is a side effect and was not part of the rationale. The BEB was created in order to alleviate clearly identified gaps and shortfalls in the Engineer capability and capacity inside the BCT.
- 6. As many as 26,600 soldiers from across the force will move or reorganize to form these new engineer battalions in each of the Army's Brigade Combat Teams (BCTs). To form the BEBs, the Army will need about 21,000 soldiers and equipment from the Brigade Special Troops Battalion in each of the 45 BCTs as well as about 5,600 personnel authorizations from the echelon-above-brigade engineer force structure. The BEBs will range in size from 417 to 460 soldiers, depending on the type of BCT it belongs to.
- 7. In the first quarter of FY2014, the Army activated five BEBs and is aggressively executing a plan to establish a total of 32 BEBs in the Active Component by the end of FY2015 and 28

BEBs in the Army National Guard by the end of FY2018. By the completion of BCT Reorganization at the end FY2018, the Army Engineer total force will be postured with 26 percent in the Active Component and 74 percent in the Reserve Component. At echelons above brigade, the Army Engineer Regiment will be postured with 15 percent in the Active Component and 85 percent in the Reserve Component.

8. The following BEBs have already been activated:

ABCTs

3rd BEB (3/1 CD) BEB at Ft Hood 91st BEB (1/1 CD) at Fort Hood 588th BEB (3/4 ID) at Ft Carson

IBCTs

21st BEB (3/101 ID) at Ft Campbell 326th BEB (1/10 ID) at Ft Campbell

IBCTs (Airborne)

37th BEB (2/82 ID) at Ft Bragg

SBCTs

16th BEB (1/1 AD) at Ft Bliss 299th BEB (1/4 ID) at Ft Carson

- 9. The 11th Engineer Battalion will deactivate on 15 Sep 2015 and reactivate on 16 Sep 2015.
 - a. It will be re-designated the 11th Brigade Engineer Battalion (BEB), 3rd Infantry Brigade Combat Team (IBCT), 3rd Infantry Division (3ID). Note: The 3/3 BCT, currently an Armored BCT, will be converting to an Infantry BCT.
 - b. The 11th has already received deactivation orders for its subordinate units and this process is underway:
 - i.The 362nd MRBC, 52nd Survey and Design Detachment, and 153rd Concrete Detachment will deactivate on 15 SEP 14.
 - ii. The 60th (Vertical) Engineer Company and 63rd (Horizontal) Engineer Company are scheduled to deactivate on 15 Sep 15.

"An email letter from a former A Company Commander to John Booth"

Dear John,

It was a nice surprise to learn that you graduated from ISB. Three of our children did also. Below is a brief statement on how we got here:

In June, 1951, after graduating from Texas A & M in Geological Engineering, I took a commission in the regular Army and was sent to Korea in March 1952. I became CO of A Co, 11th Engrs (Combat) in Sept. 1952. I extended my stay in Korea for a month in order to make Capt. and left 8 days after the cease fire. My next assignment was with the Corps of Engineers New Orleans Office with river and harbor construction for a year. About 6 months into that tour I was in my apt. on Tulane Ave. just down from the Corps Office when I heard a strong voice, "You are going to be a Missionary." How does one know if it is the voice of God? I just knew! I wanted to live a Christian life, but had never considered being a minister even less being a missionary. I had been debating whether to stay in the Army or go into the oil business, so I immediately bargained, "All right, I'll be a missionary, but let me make a million in the oil business first. I can do a lot more good rich than I can poor."

I did not hear any more voices, but I thought we had an agreement. I resigned and went to work for what is now Chevron Oil in Dallas TX and later in Iraan, TX. I did not make my million, but I was trying when I read the verse in the bible, "Seek first the Kingdom and his righteousness and all these things will be added unto you." (Matt 6:33). I closed the bible quick, but now the "Word" was not just in the book but in my heart. It kept burning until it drove me out of the oil field to study for the mission field in the seminary at TCU, Ft. Worth, TX.

I had been love struck by Joan Hovis from the first time she walked into A Co. in March 1953 to sing for us as part of a USO show touring Korea. Now 5 years later Joan came to Ft. Worth from Broadway to sing the lead role in the musical "Oklahoma." She had just received an award as one of "The Ten Most Promising Personalities on Broadway " in 1959. We were married nine months later, finished seminary in 1961 and have served in Thailand these past 53 years. I enjoyed my service in the army, but the day I enrolled in seminary was the day I felt, "This is why I was born." We are grateful for every day here, When we were to retire from the mission board in 1964, we felt, "God has called us here and has not called us back.
