From the Reunion Liaison Coordinator



BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Lieutenant Colonel Robert E. Dion Jr.

Lieutenant Colonel Dion was commissioned as an Engineer Officer in 2001 from the United States Military Academy at West Point with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering. His military education includes the Engineer Officer Basic Course, Engineer Officer Advance Course, and Intermediate Level Education.

Lieutenant Colonel Dion's previous assignments include Platoon Leader and Assault & Obstacle Platoon Leader for Bravo Company, 10th Engineer Battalion, during the battalion's deployment as part of the 3rd Infantry Divisions initial invasion into Iraq; Battalion S2 in the 10th Engineer Battalion; Military Transition Team Engineer



Advisor for the 4th Brigade, 2nd Iraqi Infantry Division in Iraq for OIF 04-05; Battalion Maintenance Officer for the 29th Engineer Battalion; and 523rd Engineer Company (Horizontal) Company Commander in the 84th Engineer Battalion during the battalion's deployment to Iraq for OIF 07-08.

Following company command, Lieutenant Colonel Dion attended Advanced Civil Schooling at the Georgia Institute of Technology and then completed a utilization tour with USACE Sacramento. Lieutenant Colonel Dion was then assigned to the 555th Engineer Brigade as the Brigade Plans Officer, Battalion S3 in the 864th Engineer Battalion, and Brigade S3.

Following his assignment in the 555th Engineer Brigade, Lieutenant Colonel Dion was selected as an Arroyo Center Fellow in Santa Monica, California and then completed a utilization tour with HQDA G8 Program Analysis & Evaluation.

Lieutenant Colonel Dion is currently the Division Engineer for the 2nd Infantry Division / ROK/U.S. Combined Division. He will assume command of the 11th Engineer Battalion in August 2019.

Lieutenant Colonel Dion's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal (with 1 oak leaf cluster), Meritorious Service Medal (with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Commendation Medal (with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Achievement Medal (with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters), Combat Action Badge, Parachutist Badge, Ranger Tab, and Sapper Tab.

Lieutenant Colonel Dion holds a Master's Degree in Engineering Management from the Missouri University of Science and Technology and a Master's Degree in Civil Engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology. He is a registered Professional Engineer in the State of Missouri, a certified Project Management Professional, and a Certified Construction Manager.

Lieutenant Colonel Dion and his wife (Angelica) have been married for nine years and have one son (Sean) and one daughter (Kelly).

SUBJECT: REUNION 2020 (MYRTLE BEACH, SC) UPDATE

1. Richel and I have made two trips to Myrtle Beach gathering information for our 2020 reunion. We have visited several hotels (two of which are on the ocean) and also explored opportunities for daytime tours and evening shows. Here's a summary of our findings/recommendations thus far:

- a. HOTEL: I am leaning towards the Beach Cove Resort, a property of 300+ privately owned condominiums that offer 1, 2 or 3 bedroom units. The facility is just over the line in North Myrtle Beach and somewhat removed from the hustle and bustle (and traffic) of Myrtle Beach proper yet close enough to allow easy access to major shops, restaurants and show venues. It offers multiple pools & hot tubs with direct access to a wide, sandy beach. IMPORTANT: the Beach Cove Resort offers a complimentary Hospitality Suite and free covered parking. (<u>https://www.beachcove.com</u>)
- b. DATES & RATES: Room rates are very dependent upon the week/month of your planned visit. September & October offer the best combination of weather and reduced rates. With that in mind we are looking at the last week in Sept or the first week in Oct. During those periods room rates including taxes, resort fee, and breakfast for two is about \$125/day...subject to further negotiation. The 2 bedroom (but only one bath) units for the same periods run about \$225/day.
- c. **ACTIVITIES:** We are still exploring options and need to make a decision on one or two days of scheduled tours. Thus far we have identified the following potential outings:
 - A day trip to Brookgreen Gardens, a former rice plantation that is now a designated National Historic Landmark (<u>https://www.brookgreen.org/</u>). Use the shuttle to get you around to tour the facilities including the sculpture garden (the Nation's largest and most extensive sculpture collection of American Figurative Sculpture), a butterfly farm and zoo, and a boat tour of the old rice fields. Lunch is available at three on site venues (the Courtyard Café, the Atrium or the Old Kitchen). The price of admission including the boat tour is TBD + motor coach transportation. NOTE: Each ticket is good for one week, great for those staying after the reunion.
 - 2) Dinner at a local restaurant in Barefoot Landing (<u>http://www.bflanding.com</u>) followed by a hit show at the Alabama Theater.
 - 3) A visit to the Myrtle Beach Aquarium and new Pearl Harbor exhibit.
 - 4) Visits to the Boardwalk, Sky Wheel, Broadway at the Beach, Family Kingdom Amusement Park are just a few of Myrtle Beach other offerings.
- d. **MEMORIAL SERVICE.** We've identified a "Memorial Park" at the old Air Force Base but are still looking for other options.
