- <u>Myrtle Beach</u> 1521. About 600 Spanish settlers led by Lucas Vazquez de Ayllon arrived nearby to Myrtle Beach with intentions of creating the first permanent settlement in North America. It was inhabited by Native Americans of the Wacamaw Tribe. From these early humble beginnings evolved the wonderful beach resort of Myrtle Beach!
- Horry County Horry County (pronounced O'Ree) was created in 1801. At that time, the county had an estimated population of only 550. Isolated by the many rivers and swamps typical of the South Carolina Lowcountry, the area essentially was surrounded by water, forcing its inhabitants to survive without much assistance from the "outside world". This caused the county residents to become an extremely independent populace, and they named their county "The Independent Republic of Horry". The county was named after, and in honor of, Revolutionary War hero Peter Horry^[4] who was born in South Carolina around 1743. Horry started his military career in 1775 as one of 20 captains, elected by the Provincial Congress of South Carolina, to serve the 1st and 2nd Regiments. In 1790, he was assigned to the South Carolina militia under the legendary Brigadier General Francis Marion, aka, "The Swamp Fox."
- <u>Georgetown County</u> The County was founded in 1769, and was named for George III, the King we rebelled against in 1776! Not holding a grudge, the residents kept the name even after independence had been fought for and won.
- Georgetown City Georgetown is the third oldest city in South Carolina and the county seat of Georgetown County, in the "Lowcountry".^[5] As of the 2010 census it had a population of 9,163.^[6] Located on Winyah Bay at the confluence of the Black, Great Pee Dee, Waccamaw, and Sampit rivers, Georgetown is the second largest seaport in South Carolina, handling over 960,000 tons of materials a year. Georgetown has many examples of early colonial architecture as well as ante-bellum architecture. It is a beautifully quaint city and proudly boasts 39 homes and buildings listed on the National Historic Register!
- Pawley's Island On the way back from Georgetown we will drive thru and stop if you'd like, at this famously quaint town. Pawley's Island is the home of the locally made (here and only here), "Pawley's Island Hammocks". The earliest known inhabitants of the Pawleys Island area were <u>Waccamaw</u> and <u>Winyah Native Americans</u>. They called the area "<u>Chiquola</u>" or "Chicora", meaning "the land". Pawley's Island is world famous for its "Pawley's Island Hammocks". Climb into one when we stop there and you'll see why! You may never want to get out!!
- Murrels Inlet The recorded history of the area begins with English colonial settlements and the land grants made by the Lords Proprietors. To encourage development of the colony of South Carolina, they granted large portions of the Waccamaw Neck to men who were willing to transport workers here and settle the land. These estates stretched from the Atlantic Ocean to the Waccamaw River.
- Our guide, Mr. Paige Sawyer, a Georgetown native, historian, and long time local guide will draw on his extensive knowledge of the history and the culture of these counties and towns and will narrate the drive from Myrtle Beach to Georgetown,

within Georgetown, and all the way back through Pawley's Island and Murrells Inlet. The tour promises to be fun and a great learning experience!

- > This enlightening and memorably tour will be on a <u>first-come</u>, <u>first-serve basis</u>. Please fill out the registration form (below), and snail-mail it in as soon as possible.
- Upon on tour arriving in Georgetown, we will go straight to the VFW Veterans Memorial and debus for the commemoration ceremony. Chaplain Jim Rock (11th) and Chaplain Ralph Tolliver (547th) will conduct the ceremony. The ceremony centers on dedicating our two bricks in the memorial garden commemorating all the veterans of the 547th En Bn and the 11th En Bn. After the ceremony, we will re-board the bus and our guide will take us to all the historic locations in town and explain their importance. Following that, we will arrive at downtown old town Georgetown and de-bus and have lunch (Dutch treat) at any one of the quaint and tasty downtown establishments. Following lunch, we will re-board our bus, and not only make our way back to the hotel, but along the way make short stops for looking around and shopping at the two well-known towns of Pawley's Island, and Murrells Inlet. SPECIAL Spouse & Guest Activity: PINE NEEDLE BASKET MAKING!

While Members are engaged in their respective Business Meetings on Saturday morning, the reunion is offering a special activity for spouses & guests who might be interested in learning about the history

and culture associated with Pine Needle Basket Weaving, a American tradition that has been passed down from generation to generation in this region of South Carolina.

WHO MAY ATTEND: Spouses & Guests of the 547th and 11th Engineer Battalions who are <u>at least 13 years of age and</u> <u>upwards.</u>

WHAT IS INVOLVED: Local expert Zada Mae will lead the class and bring everything needed to help you unleash your inner creativity to design and make your own hand-woven long needle pine basket. A fun activity, no former weaving experience is needed!



HISTORY: Pine needle basketry, conceived by Native Americans in Pre-Columbian times, is part of our American cultural heritage. Employing ancient techniques using long-leaf pine needles, this art form has remained virtually the same for thousands of years. It has evolved into the 21st century, bringing with its connections to our past a contemporary need to preserve our natural resources and appreciate our planet's gifts to mankind. In this region of South Carolina, our Native American tribes are known for crafting baskets and other useful items from long-leaf pine needles which are very plentiful in this part of South Carolina.

ABOUT THE INSTRUCTOR: Zada Mae was the primary artist for Emerald Bay Trading Company gallery at the nationally known Rain Barrell Artisan Village in the Florida Keys and is well known in international basket weaving guilds. Originally from Charleston SC, Zada Mae has been a sweet water grass and pine needle weaver for more than 30 years, learning her craft from South Carolina's famous Gullah weavers. Zada Mae will provide a short history/overview of pine needle weaving and a handout for each student.
